**The French Quarter** is New Orleans most popular neighborhood and one of the best preserved historical neighborhoods in America, with such a strong and lasting French and Spanish influence that you may really feel like you're visiting a foreign country. Don't miss out on these:

**Bourbon Street:** Lined with jazz clubs, hotels, restaurants, and boutiques. It's closed to vehicle traffic in the evening to become a party street!

**French Market:** On Decatur Street, it dates to 1791 and is the oldest farmer's market in the U.S. It's a 24-hour affair that includes both a farmers market and flea market. Find everything from dinner ingredients to souvenirs to snacks. Gater on a stick anyone?

**Jackson Square:** A statue of Andrew Jackson surrounded by historic buildings; St. Louis Cathedral – the oldest continuously active cathedral in the U.S., The Cabildo – site of the Louisiana Purchase, and The Presbytère – a Mardi Gras Museum.

**Steamboat:** Board the historic Natchez and experience the sights and sounds of river life that enchanted Mark Twain – and see the bustling activity of our nation's second largest port!

**The Aquarium of the Americas:** Enter through a thirty-foot tunnel surrounded by 132,000 gallons of water and fascinating creatures from North and South American waterways.

**Audubon Zoo of New Orleans:** With approximately two thousand animals, it's one of the premiere zoos in the country. Tour either on foot or aboard the swamp train.
